### **General Notes:**

- 1. RTA listed campsite locations shown in RED.
- 2. "North" means "towards Ottawa". In practice this is often not true north.
- 3. In column 2, a "+" sign after the waypoint ref. indicates that the campsite is not directly on the RT, but lies off the trail, accessed from a point north of the given waypoint. Similarly, a "-" sign means the campsite is accessed from a point south of the given waymark.

- 5. Most campsites are seasonal only, except for Doe Lake in Frontenac Park (year round)
- 6. Always book ahead for all campsites unless they are primitive ones not managed.
- 7. There are 13 campsites along the route of the RT. 5 are on the RT and 8 are off it.
- 8. Of the 8 campsites off the RT, 6 are less than 1 km off the RT, one is 1.4 km away and one is 3.0 km away.
- 9. Distance between campsites varies from 5.0 km to 62.5 km. See table below:

- 10. Coincidentally, the distance to the first campsite from either end of the RT is 21.2 km
- 11. Distances between campsites in excess of 30 km will be too much for typical hikers. In fact, ideal distances between campsites should be in the range of 20 km. Based on a 30 km max. distance, there are 3 stretches of trail that desperately need an extra camping option:
  - 02B+ (Kingston KOA) to 04G (Doe Lake): 47.3 km
  - 09A+ (Murphys Point) to 11C+ (Beveridges Locks): 45.7 km
  - 14A+ (Burritts Rapids) to 18G+ (Wesley Clover): 62.5 km
- 12. There are some potential opportunities by more closely linking in Richmond to the main trail route. Currently Richmond is only connected by blue side trails. Some camping and B&B options may apparently exist in or around Richmond details should be explored. This would be one way to reduce the longest section of trail without campsites. This is worth a separate discussion.
- 13. Making use of the listed off-trail campsites will add only about 15 km to the total length of an E2E hike.
